Notes:

1. Shackleton WR960 and Belvedere XG454 are another former Manchester Museum of Science and Industry inmates and should be followed out imminently by P1A WG763 and Avro 707A WZ736, this pair heading South to join the Boscombe Down Aviation Collection at Old Sarum.
2. In a well-publicised move, 146 CC2 ZE701 was delivered to Duxford on 24 January 2022 for preservation and registered as G-CMEU in connection with this. ZE700 is due to go to St Athan while the two C3s, ZE707 and ZE708 are headed to a civilian operator.
3. Three RAF E-3Ds have been bought by Chile for delivery within around a year. One is for spares use, presumably ZH103, which has been in store for some time.
4. Poseidon MRA1 ZP809 was delivered to Lossiemouth on 11 January 2022 and completes the set currently on order.
5. It has recently been announced that Pumas will replace the Bells based in Brunei and Cyprus on a temporary basis before a new type is ordered. Additionally the Airbus H135 will replace the remaining Gazelle fleet by March 2024.
